I am fulfilled when I see happiness, hope and independence in people with disabilities. I am not able to use my words to describing it because my happiness is not measured by materials things. I am thrilled to be in Brockport and I am gaining priceless experiences and an amazing opportunity in the areas of research, teaching, and program leadership.
