The Department of Physical Education at the University of South Carolina seeking applications for a full-time (9-month) teaching fellow with responsibilities in adapted physical education and physical education pedagogy to begin August 2020.

Responsibilities:

The successful candidate will be expected to manage a 4/4 teaching load or the equivalent that may include: (1) teaching adapted physical education and physical education instruction and curriculum courses at the undergraduate and master's level; (2) supervising students in practicum classes and in student teaching; (3) ongoing development of online coursework in the MS-APE program.

Qualifications:

Candidates must have (1) an earned doctorate in physical education and/or adapted physical education, (2) evidence of previous college level teaching in adapted physical education, and (3) an ability to work cooperatively with colleagues. Preference will be given to applicants who possess (1) K-12 and teaching experience; (2) strong record of teaching adapted physical education; and (3) expertise in alternative course delivery, teaching with technology, and/or distributed learning formats.
